## BEHAVIOR WORD OF THE MONTH

We not only see this is individuals that are neurodivergent, but many neurotypical individuals also stim without knowing it! Do you tap your leg when you're anxious? Or rub your feet together the moment you sit on the couch to relax? Those are stims because they bring a sense of comfort or stimulation to our bodies. Other examples of stims include hand flapping, jumping up and down, and pacing back and forth.

### ANDERSON


